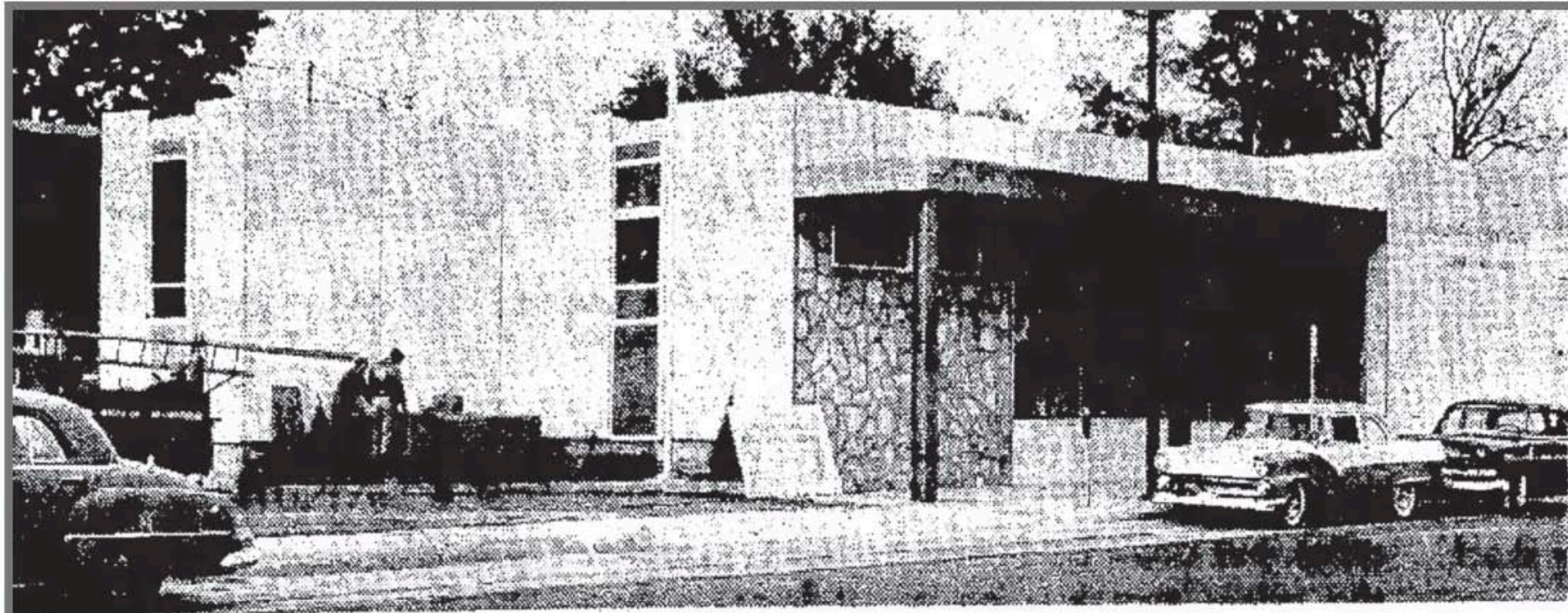

Shiloff, Sioux City, and is being leased to the Post Office Department for 10 years. No date has been set for moving facilities from the present building.

Set Date for Completion of Post Office Building

CLEAR LAKE — Construction of Clear Lake's new Post Office Building is to be completed for occupancy by May 15, 1960, Postmaster Mary Doris Carroll has been informed by regional postal authorities.

The anticipated completion date was included in a letter to the postmaster which formally advised her of the Post Office Department's acceptance of the lease agreement offered by Hyman H. Shiloff of Sioux City.

At the same time, the City of Clear Lake was notified that the Post Office Department's option on the building site had been assigned to Mr. and Mrs. Shiloff.

The new post office will be constructed on the property formerly occupied by the Methodist church and parsonage, at 1st Ave. N. and 5th St.

The parsonage was moved last month to a new site on 2nd Ave. N. The city previously had acquired the old church site and developed it as an off-street parking lot. However, it was offered to the department at the same price the city had paid for it.

The Shiloffs were successful bidders for the agreement in which the Post Office Department leases the building for 10 years with two five-year extensions optional. The Shiloffs must now purchase the site and construct the building to the department's specifications.

The front of the new building, to be of natural stone and pre-cast concrete panel construction, will face 1st Ave. N. It will contain 5,200 square feet of floor space.
